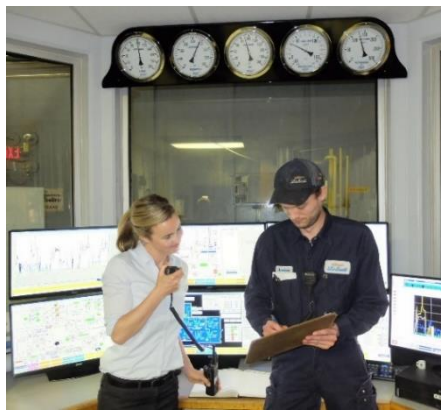

**How many branches are there?** There is an IPE branch in each Province, each Province has local Branches. The two branches in this area are the **London Branch** and **Hamilton Branch**.

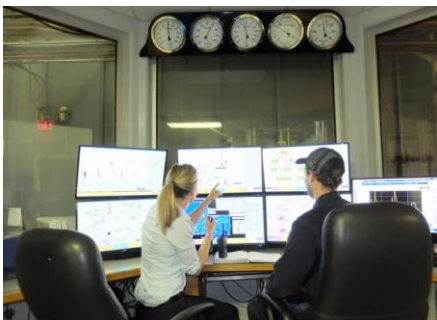
